

Đani Martinić

Đani Martinić rođen je 2. srpnja 1987. u Supetru na Braču, gdje završava osnovnu školu. Srednju umjetničku školu (slikarski smjer) pohađa i završava u Splitu te na splitskoj Umjetničkoj akademiji studira kiparstvo: 2010. završava preddiplomski studij kiparstva u klasi prof. Matka Mijića, prvu godinu diplomskog studija provodi u klasi prof. Kuzme Kovačića te 2012. magistrira u klasi prof. Nikole Džaje. Odmah po diplomi postaje vanjskim suradnikom na Odsjeku za kiparstvo Umjetničke akademije u Splitu, a trenutno je u statusu asistenta – vanjskog suradnika. Od 2009. sudjeluje na devetnaest skupnih izložaba te na brojnim likovnim kolonijama. Samostalno izlaze 2010. u Bolu na Braču te 2012. u Splitu. Autor je sedam javnih skulptura, a 2016., u timu Martinić – Šitum – Vujičić, osvaja prvu nagradu na natječaju za Spomenik Gaji Bulatu u Splitu.

Đani Martinić

Đani Martinić was born in 1987 in Supetar, on the island of Brač. He finished primary school in his home town. He graduated from School of Fine Arts (Dept. of Painting) in Split in 2007. He studied in the class of Professor Matko Mijić at the Academy of Arts in Split and received a B.A. degree in sculpture in 2010. He completed his first year of the graduate programme in the class of Professor Kuzma Kovačić and the second year in the class of Professor Nikola Džaja. He earned his M.A. degree in 2012 and promptly became a visiting teaching assistant at the Department of Sculpture of his alma mater.

Since 2009 Đani Martinić had two solo exhibitions, in Bol (Brač) in 2010 and in 2012 in Split, and took part in 19 collective exhibitions and five workshops / art colonies. He is the author of seven public sculptures. He was on the Martinić – Šitum – Vujičić team that won first prize at the competition for Gajo Bulat's monument in Split.

μολοσσός / molos / molossus

Ova izložba mladog kipara Đanija Martinića uz dva skulpturalna rada u akristalu (muški akt *Spodoban-ko*, 2012. te ansambl ovce i piletlova u borbi *Ku-kuriku, beeeeee...*, 2016.) sadrži i jedan zvukovni rad (interaktivna audio instalacija asocijativnog naziva *I cvrči, cvrči cvrč...*, 2012.), koji ih povezuje i kontekstualizira te samu izložbu primiče glazbi i temi ovo-godišnje *Noći muzeja*.

Svaki od ta tri rada izravno ili neizravno, posredno ili neposredno, ali nikako napadno ili sirovo, asocira antičku Grčku, njenu umjetnost, dramu, poeziju, muziku... Stoga ne čudi da smo ovu izložbu Đanija Martinića nazvali *molos*, prema stopi u antičkoj metriči sastavljenoj od triju dugih slogova – koja se rijetko zatjeće samostalno u stihu – i to baš grčkom riječi *μολοσσός*.

Tragiku junaka i naravoučenje basne Martinić ironizira kolorističkim akcentima (plavo i crveno na bijelom), ne da bi ih doveo u pitanje, nego da bi nijemim skulpturama omogućio da se snažno oglase – kriknu, beknu, zakokotaju – da se njihovo glasanje prožme sa stvarnim glasanjem cvrčaka, koje otvara prostor i transcendira pojavnost.



Muze li su te što su pomogle da se ovom izložbom Dioniz i Apolon ujedinjuju u oksimoron života? (bp)

This exhibition presents two acrystal sculptures by young artist Đani Martinić: a male nude An Apparition Man (2012), and Crow, baaa (2016) that shows sheep and cocks fighting. It also presents an interactive audio installation And the chirring cicada chirrs and chirrs away... (2012) which connects the sculptures, provides context, and draws the exhibition to both music and the theme of this year's Museums at Night event.

Directly or indirectly – but without any ostentation – each of these three artworks makes a reference to Ancient Greece, its art, drama, poetry, music... It is, therefore, not surprising that for the title of this exhibition we chose μολοσσός/molossus, the Greek word for a metrical foot consisting of three long syllables that rarely occur in one verse.

With colour accents of blue and red on white Martinić manifests his irony about the hero's tragic condition and the moral of the fable, not in order to question them but to give the silent sculptures a strong voice, so that through a cry, bleat, or crow their voices meld with the real song of cicadas, song that gives substance to space and transcends manifestation.

We cannot help but muse if it was the Muse that made Dionysus and Apollo fuse into an oxymoron of life. (bp)
