

Ovogodišnjom izložbom mladih diplomanada zagrebačke Akademije likovnih umjetnosti u klanjkoj Galeriji Antuna Augustinčića ostvarujemo sedam godina bogate suradnje dviju ustanova kojima je bavljenje kiparstvom i kiparima bilo ne samo ugrađeno u temelje osnutka, nego je postalo dio identiteta i smjer budućeg razvoja. Romana Nikolić, Martina Nikoljačić i Vladimir Novak kiparstvom se bave predano i istraživački: svatko na svoj način, sebi svojstvenim materijalom i tehnološkim postupkom, oni ispituju prostorno-likovne odnose te psihološka, socijalna i komunikacijska prožimanja umjetnosti i suvremenog svijeta.

Rad **Romane Nikolić** pod nazivom *Živi mrtvac* dio je opsežne konstruktivističke instalacije kojom se 2016. predstavila na završnoj izložbi studenata ALU na Jabukovcu, propitujući odnos pojedinca i društva. Ljudska figura u crnoj plastičnoj vreći okružena opasnom »šumom« oštredih metalnih vršaka, na likovnoj i simboličkoj razini dojmljivo dočarava čovjekovu nemoć da se suprotstavi agresivnom i destruktivnom okružju koje mu nameće svoja pravila.

*S*et up in the Antun Augustinčić Gallery in Klanjec, this year's exhibition of works by young graduates of the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb marks seven years of intense collaboration of these two institutions, for which sculpture and sculptors are not only in their foundations, but also in their identity and their development. Romana Nikolić, Martina Nikoljačić and Vladimir Novak are devoted to sculpting and to exploring the art of sculpture. Each of them in their own way – in the material, technology, and method of choice – they examine visual and spatial relations, as well as psychological, social, and communicational interpenetration of art and the contemporary world.

The Living Corpse is a part of the extensive constructivist installation that **Romana Nikolić** presented at the final year students exhibition of the Academy of Fine Arts in 2016 and through which she examined the relation between an individual and the society. Surrounded by a dangerous thicket of metal spikes, a human figure wrapped in a black plastic bag evokes impressively man's inability to counter the aggressive and destructive environment that imposes its rules.

Martina Nikoljačić is preoccupied with mass communication used by the media to create impression, to stimulate consumerism and the needs and desires it generates. Her sarcastic visualisation of verbal communication exposes the lies of commercials (often political) and their promising messages (Let's play display). It points out the omnipresent banalisation of all things, even those precious treasures that we would like to keep pure and untarnished at the bottom of grandma's old chest (BlablaLicious).

Romana Nikolić rođena je 1992. u Zagrebu, gdje je 2010. maturirala na grafičkom odsjeku Škole primijenjene umjetnosti i dizajna. Diplomirala je 2017. likovnu kulturu na nastavničkom odsjeku Akademije likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu u klasi profesora Nevena Bilića. Dobitnica je Rektoreve nagrade 2016./2017. i nizozemske nagrade za mlade umjetnike NEU NOW 2017 – Europe's Emerging Artists. Sudjelovala je u realizaciji izložaba (Zaprešić, Beograd, Novi Sad, Đurđevac, Zagreb) i simpozija (Drugi međunarodni simpozij o pedagogiji u umjetnosti, Osijek, 2017.) te assistirala kiparu Vladimiru Herljeviću pri restauraciji javnih plastika na Mirogoju i Zrinjevcu u Zagrebu. Pridjela je dvije samostalne izložbe u Zagrebu 2017. Bila je dobbitnica sveučilišne stipendije za izvrsnost (2013./2014. i 2014./2015.). Uključena je u projekte Turističke zajednice grada Zagreba vezane za kulturni turizam i osmišljavanje vizualnih identiteta.

Martina Nikoljačić rođena je 1980. u Slavonskom Brodu, gdje završava srednjoškolsko obrazovanje. Godine 2017. diplomirala je kiparstvo na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu u klasi profesora Nevena Bilića. Dobitnica je Rektoreve nagrade 2016./2017. i nizozemske nagrade za mlade umjetnike NEU NOW 2017 – Europe's Emerging Artists. Sudjelovala je u realizaciji izložaba (Transform 2016: Transformation of Image, Zagreb; Ksenija Turčić – Sjene te Joie de vivre, Zagreb i Osijek). Njen rad Primus inter pares postavljen je 2016. kao javna skulptura (vtvrta Husqvarna) u Zagrebu. Dosad je sudjelovala na petnaestak skupnih izložbi u zemlji i inozemstvu (Zagreb, Đurđevac, Lausanne, Amsterdam, České Budějovice) te na kiparskim radionicama (Hvar, Bjelovar, Zagreb, Jarčevac, Vrsar). Samostalno je izlagao dvaput u Zagrebu (s O. Kecerinom 2016. i T. Hršakom, 2017.).

Vladimir Novak examines relations among his spatial compositions, abstract forms executed in concrete. Curious about their position in space, he also tests the nature of the material, exploring closeness and/or contrast to architecture, harmony and/or opposition to strength and organic distortion. The concrete elements of the Spiritual Machines – visually reduced to the terse features of signs – become a site from which spirit can soar and/or land on.

Martina Nikoljačić was born in 1980 in Zagreb, where she graduated from the School of Applied Arts (Dept. of Graphic Arts) in 2010. In 2017 she graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb, Dept. of Sculpture, in the class of Professor Neven Bilić. She received the Rector's Award (2016/2017) and the Dutch NEU NOW Award for Europe's Emerging Artists for 2017. She participated in the production of exhibitions Transform 2016: Transformation of Image, Zagreb; Ksenija Turčić: Shadow, and Joie de vivre, Zagreb–Osijek. In 2016, her work Roots was selected for the holdings of the Academy of Fine Arts, and The Sacred Place was installed as a public sculpture in Zagreb, on the grounds of the Husqvarna company. She has taken part in fifteen collective exhibitions and workshops, and had her first solo exhibition in Zagreb in 2015. She is a member of the D. K. Living Studio artistic collective. Apart from sculpture, she creates set designs (Brač Film Festival; MP Films Production, 2016), and workshops (Hvar, Bjelovar, Zagreb, Jarčevac, Vrsar). He had two joint exhibitions in Zagreb, with Ozren Kecerin in 2016 and with Tomislav Hršak in 2017.




